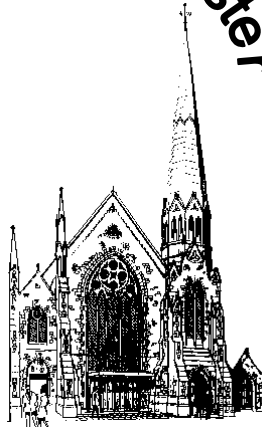

Journey to the Stable 2024

It is only about 6 weeks before we open the South Street church doors and welcome school children and adults to experience the real meaning of Christmas. This year we are re-vamping the station boards to make them more up-to-date and consolidating a couple of the stations into one so 7 stations will become 5. We are also shortening the times for the four days when we open to the public.

We will be needing people to help with the school visits (two schools have already booked) and the public openings. We are also looking for people on school visit days who would be willing to dress up and be in the stable as Mary and Joseph, which will add to the children's experience.

Reverse Advent Calendar

Many of us buy an Advent Calendar each year. We open it each day in December and receive a gift, often of a sweet or chocolate. We are suggesting that this year, as we journey through Advent, we MAKE a small gift each day before we receive on Christmas Day the greatest gift of all, God's son, Jesus, to be our Saviour.

We hope that each of us will take a jam jar and put a coin in it each day from Advent Sunday, which this year is on 3rd December, until Christmas Day. The coin may be 1p or 5p or 50p or even more; it does not have to be the same amount each day. Please hand the money in on Christmas Day or one of the next two Sundays. All the money will then go to the [Food Bank](#). Obviously, the Food Bank will not receive it before Christmas, but we are assured that they need money all the year round.

Please use one of your own jam jars if you can, but we hope to have spare ones available for you to take on Advent Sunday and the Sunday before, 26th November.
