# **Vision Meeting: Small Groups**

Small groups are a very positive part of our church and there is a varied range of different groups available. However, the main focus of our meeting on 19th September was on home groups/Bible study groups. We discussed the points raised in the article in the August/September edition of the Vision magazine and how they could be developed. Currently, there are four Home/Fellowship groups listed in the Church Contacts, one meeting in the afternoon and three in the evening. They are all greatly valued but are at their capacity, making it difficult for any new members to join. We would like to be able to make more home groups are available but, in order to do this, we need people willing to lead them. It was felt very strongly that anyone being asked to consider leading a group should be provided with the support necessary to do so. This would involve access to training and support from others with experience of leading small groups.

# Next steps:

- To find out who would be interested in joining a home group if new ones are available.
- To enable those with leadership experience to share their knowledge of running home groups to encourage others to volunteer as leaders.
- To offer training to those volunteers.
- To work out practicalities such as timings of the group(s) and resources (e.g. Bible study notes, books, DVDs, etc).

We would like to be able to bring some proposals to the next church meeting in November on how this can be taken forward. Do you have ideas or suggestions? # **Christmas shoe boxes**

For the last five years we have participated in a <u>Christmas shoe box scheme</u> run by the UK charity <u>House of Opportunity</u> based at <u>St Paul's Church, Salisbury</u>. The charity combats the exploitation of vulnerable young people and communities in south east Europe, helping to prevent poverty and modern slavery and enabling marginalised people to realise a better future for themselves and their children.

This year Christmas shoe boxes will be distributed to abandoned children living in state care, poor rural schools and kindergartens, women's refuges, prisoners' children, isolated elderly people, refugees and Roma children living in difficult conditions. Leaflets will be available soon. The Christmas boxes will be dedicated on **Sunday 17**th **November** and collected the next day.
